She earned her Bachelor of Science in Child & Family Studies from ECU. Soon after graduation, she began her career with the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. She served as a Family Support Specialist I, II, and III where she determined eligibility for government assistance programs, such as Medicaid long-term care and Medicare Saving Program. She later promoted into the role of Claims Specialist where she investigated potential fraud involving government assistant programs. In 2018, she accepted a promotion with the Office of the Ombudsman, where she served as a Management Review Officer. In this role, she reviewed state and federal regulations to ensure compliance and uphold integrity within the DCBS offices statewide. In July 2025, after 15 years of dedicated service to the Commonwealth, she made the difficult but faith-driven decision to resign from her career with the state.
